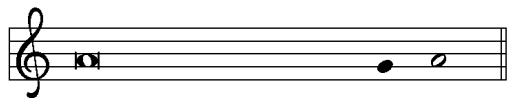

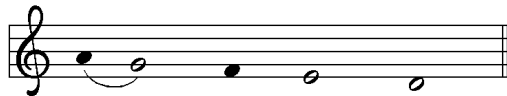

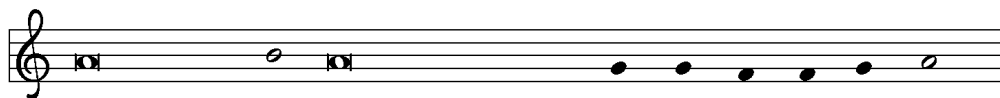

Scripture Story in your hands... (Jeremiah 36: 1-8, 21-23, 27-28; 31: 31-34)
